ASSESSMENT

Product description and intended use


The Certificate holder provided the following description for the products under assessment. Hambleside Danelaw GRP Bonding Gutters consist of glass fibre-reinforced polyester laminates in a range of profiles (see Figures 1 and 2).

The product codes are:


- BG Bonding Gutter with a mortar bonding strip along the centre line of the upper surface
- DBG1 a dry fix bonding gutter incorporating a central upstand of 70 mm to suit slates and flat interlocking and plain tiles
- DBG2 a dry fix bonding gutter incorporating a central upstand of 100 mm to suit profiled tiles (one or both sides) and typical Scottish practice, where tiling battens may occur on one side only.

The products are supplied in 3 m lengths and in widths of 225 mm (BG) and 210 mm (DBG1 and DBG2).

The products are finished in Anthracite grey and have a laminated film on the upper surface.



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<u>Definitions for products and applications inspected</u>

Pitched roofs are defined for the purpose of this Certificate as those having a fall in excess of 1:6.

Product assessment – key factors

The products were assessed for the following key factors, and the outcome of the assessment is shown below. Conclusions relating to the Building Regulations apply to the whole of the UK unless otherwise stated.

1 Mechanical resistance and stability

Data were assessed for the following characteristics.

1.1.2 On the basis of data assessed, Hambleside Danelaw GRP Bonding Gutters will resist the normal loads and impacts associated with installation and use.

2 Safety in case of fire

2.1 External fire spread

- 2.1.2 On the basis of data assessed, the products are unrestricted by the documents supporting the national Building Regulations with respect to proximity to a relevant boundary.
- 2.1.3 This classification can be affected by other components of the roof, eg insulation materials, substrates/decking and membranes. These constructions must therefore be evaluated by reference to the requirements of the documents supporting the relevant national Building Regulations and any consequent restrictions imposed by those documents, on a case-by-case basis.

2.2 Reaction to fire

- 2.2.1 The Certificate holder has not declared a reaction to fire classification for the products to BS EN 13501-1: 2018.
- 2.2.2 Designers must refer to the relevant national Building Regulations and guidance for detailed conditions of use, particularly in respect of substrate fire performance, cavity barriers, service penetrations and combustibility limitations for other materials and components used in the overall construction.

8.3 Service life

Under normal service conditions, the products will have a life of at least 20 years, provided they are designed, installed and maintained in accordance with this Certificate and the Certificate holder's instructions.

PROCESS ASSESSMENT

Information provided by the Certificate holder was assessed for the following factors:

9 Design, installation, workmanship and maintenance

9.1 Design


- 9.1.1 The design process was assessed by the BBA and the following requirements apply in order to satisfy the performance specified in this Certificate.
- 9.1.2 The products must be designed in accordance with the relevant parts of BS 5534 : 2014, BS 8000-0 : 2014 and BS 8000-6 : 2023.

9.2 Installation

- 9.2.1 Installation instructions provided by the Certificate holder were assessed and judged to be appropriate and adequate.
- 9.2.2 Installation of Hambleside Danelaw GRP Bonding Gutters must be in accordance with this Certificate, the Certificate holder's instructions and the relevant recommendations of BS 5534 : 2014, BS 8000-0 : 2014 and BS 8000-6 : 2023.
- 9.2.3 The underlay and battens over the joint area of the party wall must be made good. Battens may cross over the party wall without trimming.
- 9.2.4 The adjoining roof must be prepared by marking and cutting the tiles or slates to a straight line, midway over the party wall, and renewing or replacing any defective or decayed underlay, battens and nails back to the nearest appropriate rafter.

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- 9.2.5 The bonding gutter is positioned and nailed to the battens (or sarking boards in Scottish practice) through the outer flanges only and at 500 mm centres maximum, using nails of a quality acceptable in good roofing practice.
- 9.2.6 Consecutive lengths of the bonding gutter are laid, allowing a 150 mm overlap when measured vertically at the joints and extending over the fascia board into the gutter.
- 9.2.7 With the BG bonding gutter, the tiles or slates must be fixed with a butt joint over the centre of the bonding gutter and bedded onto mortar or mastic laid on the mortar bonding strip. The water channels must be left free from mortar or mastic (Figure 3).



9.2.8 With the DBG1 and DBG2 bonding gutters, the sides of the central upstand must be pinched together when nailing, and the slates or tiles must be laid close to or touching the central upstand on both sides (Figure 4). Care must

• avoid any pressure or distortion

be taken to:

- maintain the straight line appearance of the profile
- avoid nailing into or between the water channels.

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9.3 Workmanship

Practicability of installation was assessed by the BBA, on the basis of the Certificate holder's information and site visits to witness installations in progress. To achieve the performance described in this Certificate, installation of the products must be carried out by roofers experienced with these types of products.

9.4 Maintenance and repair

- 9.4.1 Ongoing satisfactory performance of the products in use requires that they are suitably maintained. The guidance provided by the Certificate holder was assessed by the BBA and found to be appropriate and adequate. The following requirements apply to satisfy the performance assessed in this Certificate:
- 9.4.2 As the products are fully or partially confined and have suitable durability, maintenance is not required.
- 9.4.3 Damaged lengths can be replaced without having to remove adjacent lengths.

10 Manufacture

- 10.1 The production processes for the products have been assessed, and provide assurance that the quality controls are satisfactory according to the following factors:
- 10.1.1 The manufacturer has provided documented information on the materials, processes, testing and control factors.
- 10.1.2 The quality control operated over batches of incoming materials has been assessed and deemed appropriate and adequate.
- 10.1.3 The quality control procedures and product testing to be undertaken have been assessed and deemed appropriate and adequate.
- 10.1.4 The process for management of non-conformities has been assessed and deemed appropriate and adequate.
- 10.1.5 An audit of each production location was undertaken, and it was confirmed that the production process was in accordance with the documented process, and that equipment has been properly tested and calibrated.
- †10.2 The BBA has undertaken to review the above measures on a regular basis through a surveillance process, to verify that the specifications and quality control operated by the manufacturer are being maintained.

11 Delivery and site handling

- 11.1 The Certificate holder stated that the products are delivered to site in packs of 10 units bearing the product code, application instructions, size and the BBA logo incorporating the number of this Certificate.
- 11.2 Delivery and site handing must be performed in accordance with the Certificate holder's instructions and this Certificate, including:
- 11.2.1 The packs must be stored flat or on end, on a smooth, clean, dry surface, under cover and protected from sunlight.
